

## Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya delivers Inaugural Address at National Ayush Mission Conclave

Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya delivered the inaugural address at the National AYUSH Mission Conclave organized by Ministry of AYUSH, here today. The event witnessed the launch of Information and Communication Technology initiatives namely AHMS (Ayush Health Management Information System) and eLMS (Education Learning Management System) by Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Union Health Minister and Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, Union AYUSH Minister in the presence of Dr. Munjpara Mahendrabhai, Minister of State, AYUSH, State Health Ministers who joined the meeting included Shri Datta Shanker Mishra (Uttar Pradesh), Dr. R. Lalhangliana (Mizoram), Dr. A. K. Ali (Andhra Pradesh), Shri Keshab Mahanta (Assam), Shri S. Pangnyu Phom (Nagaland), Shri Banna Gupta (Jharkhand). Lauding the vision of the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi that envisages integrated healthcare services in the nation by synergizing the capacities and resources of both tradition and modern medicine, Dr. Mandaviya noted "India is significantly strengthening its healthcare services by striving towards an Integrated Health Policy that will benefit not just the nation, but serve the world." Elaborating further, he stated that "the collaboration between modern and traditional medicine is striving towards establishing multiple systems of medicine at a single platform facilitating cross-referrals and enabling better integration of different systems of medicine." Dr. Mandaviya commended the integration of Ayush systems in central government hospitals and further added "To fully empower the present healthcare system, it is important to integrate Ayush into mainstream public healthcare delivery as this integration can

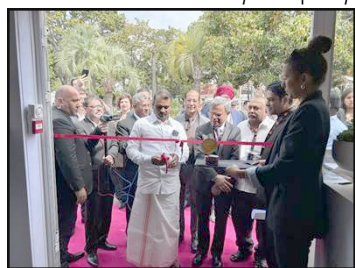
offer a more comprehensive and holistic approach to patient care, combining the strengths of both conventional medicine and Ayush systems of healthcare." Highlighting the importance and relevance of our heritage of Ayurveda and traditional principles Dr. Mandaviya stated "India's heritage of traditional medicine advocates and adopts a holistic perspective towards health with a focus on wellness at its foundation." Commending the initiatives of 'Heal by India' and 'Heal in India' that have been well received by the world, the Union Health Minister said "there is an increasing inflow of patients from world over who are travelling to India to receive treatment, and a rapidly growing demand for medical professionals from India trained both in modern and traditional medicine." He further cited the development of the WHO-Global Centre for Traditional Medicine at Jamnagar, Gujarat, enabling India as a global leader in Traditional Medicine. Thanking Dr. Mandaviya for the support extended in the momentum of Integrative Medicine, the Union AYUSH Minister said "Mainstreaming the potential of Ayush within a pluralistic system of integrative healthcare is being envisioned through the new initiatives of Ministry of Ayush in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare." He further added "National Ayush Mission (NAM) provides support to the state and union territories for co-location of Ayush facilities in Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs) and District Hospitals (DHS). Additionally, he cited the provision for setting up integrated Ayush hospitals, new Ayush dispensaries in various parts of the country are in the pipeline to facilitate easy accessibility and affordability of Ayush services for the masses."



## Dr L Murugan inaugurates India Pavilion at Marche du Film, says films carry India's strength in storytelling across the world

World has only scratched the surface of Indian creativity and capability: Shri Anurag Thakur

Union Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting Dr L Murugan today inaugurated the India Pavilion at Cannes at Marche du Film in presence of Shri Jawed Ashraf, Ambassador of India to France, Shri Pithul Kumar, Joint Secretary, MIB and stars of the Indian film industry. Addressing a gathering of delegates from India including film stars and officials, Dr Murugan stated that today India is the world's largest producer of films with over 3000 films in over 50 languages. These films carry a message of India's strength in storytelling across the world. Citing the example of the now famed 'Elephant Whisperer' of Mukulraj, the Minister highlighted that today good content knows no boundaries and we are witnessing an era where Indian content is going local to global. Dr Murugan recalled the extraordinary success of Indian movies and movie makers at world stage and added that today it's difficult to find a movie without an Indian name in its credits for animation or VFX. He further said that Indian film industry has undergone significant changes in recent years with advent of newer technologies and rise of digital and streaming platforms. The Minister stated that Indian Media and Entertainment sector is poised to experience an extraordinary growth rate of 11.4% in 2023, propelling its revenue to a staggering INR 2.36 trillion. This remarkable surge is a testament to the robustness of India's M&E industry and its potential to create novel opportunities, even in a rapidly evolving digital landscape. He further added that after the Covid pandemic, the gross box office revenues of 2022 in India, have increased almost three times the revenues of 2021 to 1.3 billion USD, and expected to touch 3 billion USD by 2025. Speaking about the measures taken by the Ministry towards strengthening the film ecosystem in India, Dr Murugan said that a slew of initiatives through Digital India, StartUp India, rural telecom



connectivity, policy reforms for data affordability and availability are creating a robust foundation of a Creative Economy. "Our technological forte of the IT sector merged with the rich talent pool of artists, makes India the best suited for serving as the Content Creator for the global Cinema. Our government had set up a task force for the promotion of this sector. A National Centre of Excellence for AVGC is also in pipeline", he added. Dr Murugan pitched India as an attractive movie destination for foreign films and said that the Government is committed to develop India as a magnet for international movie industry including shooting, co-production, animation and low-cost post-production. The Minister expressed hope that after announcements of film incentives by Union Minister Shri Anurag Thakur last year at Cannes, India's promising presence in Cannes 2023 will take this momentum further. As India prepares to host the

G20 summit, he said that "we are placing a special emphasis on the significance of Culture & Tourism. We aim to leverage the power of media and entertainment to position culture as a driving force for inclusive, sustainable socio-economic recovery and development, paving the way for a brighter future for all. One Earth - One family - One Future is the sure way forward." Minister Shri Anurag Thakur addressing the gathering through a video message. In his message, the Minister remarked "that the Festival de Cannes' has played an instrumental role in not just promoting our cinematic excellence but also strengthening the Indo-French relations. He emphasized that for the first time this year, we have sent an official delegation of talented filmmakers from the North Eastern States of India to the Cannes Film Festival. The idea, he said, was to bring to Cannes the depth and diversity of India's rich cinematic culture while we recognize and promote regional diversity in filmmaking back home. He informed the audience that National Film Archive of India has digitised the negatives of 'Ishanou', the Manipuri Language film, selected in the Cannes Classic Section this year. Shri Thakur further said that with 3 films shortlisted in 3 distinct categories and 2 of them bringing home Oscars - the world has just scratched the surface of the creativity, content and technical capabilities of the Indian Film Industry. With powerful narratives, high-end skill-based content creation and post-production capabilities and co-production treaties with 16 countries, India has emerged as an attractive destination for filmmakers worldwide, he added. Earlier, Shri Jawed Ashraf, Ambassador of India to France, in his address to the gathering called for a bigger, more organised presence at Cannes and other festivals, and for a more aggressive approach to promote Indian films. A larger presence, he added, will do justice to the scale and strength of Indian cinema. Mr. Guillaume Esmiol, Executive Director, Marche du Film at Cannes Film Festival said that India was an important country for the global film industry by way of being a strong market and with its scale of movie industry. The event also witnessed the unveiling of the poster and trailer for 54th Indian Film Festival of India to be organized in Goa in November, 2023.

## Ministry of Civil Aviation organizes Curtain Raiser event for Wings India 2024

The Ministry of Civil Aviation in collaboration with Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI) organized a curtain raiser ahead of Wings India 2024 in New Delhi on 18th May, 2023. Shri Jyotiraditya Scindia, Union Minister of Civil Aviation and Steel unveiled the event and promo video and released the Wings India 2024 brochure. Civil Aviation Minister Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia said that the Government is giving special focus on creating capacity for the country's fast-growing aviation market, by changing its role from a regulator to a facilitator. Addressing the curtain raiser event for Wings India 2024 in New Delhi on Thursday, Union Civil Aviation and Steel Minister said that the government has adopted a 3-pronged strategy of creating capacities, removing

bottlenecks and simplifying processes, that has helped the sector to leap from 74 airports to 148 airports in the past nine years. Setting a target for the industry he said that the number of airports, heliports, and waterdromes will go up to more than 200 in the next three to four years. Sharing his thoughts on the growing potential of the industry to become the world's leading aviation market by 2047, the Minister added "As India sails on its journey from the Amrit Kaal to Shatabdi Kaal (2047), Indian aviation will also transform from being the third largest domestic market/eighth largest international market/seventh largest domestic and international market, to become the largest aviation market globally." Reiterating the government's commitment to creating an international aviation hub in the country, he

said a large number of air services and open skies agreements inked between India and other nations would facilitate this growth target. Civil Aviation Secretary Shri Rajiv Bansal in his address said that major airports of the country are growing and many of them are already implementing their expansion plans. He said, currently India is connected to less than 100 destinations globally, but there is a huge potential to improve international connectivity. Shri Bansal also added that there has been growth in the small aircraft segment, he said, "Newer airports are getting inaugurated under the UDAN Regional Connectivity Scheme and it will enable more people from tier-2 and tier-3 cities to come to the domestic aviation map. He said that the large order by Indian aviation companies

indicates that this dream of creating international hubs in India is soon to be a reality. Shri Sanjeev Kumar, Chairman, Airport Authority of India, Mr. Remi Mailard, MD, Airbus, Shailesh Pathak, Secretary General, FICCI and other officials from MoCA, AAI, representatives from Foreign missions and industry were also present. Scheduled to take place from 18th to 21st January 2024 in Hyderabad, Wings India 2024, is expected to be Asia's largest event on Civil Aviation on Commercial, General and Business Aviation. Wings India 2024 will bring together various stakeholders and participants from all over the world from the aviation industry to promote collaboration, showcase innovations and explore business opportunities.

## Shri Bhupender Yadav inaugurates Pashmina Certification Centre set up in Wildlife Institute of India (WII) Dehradun



Union Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and Labour and Employment, Shri Bhupender Yadav inaugurated Pashmina Certification Centre (PCC) set up in Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun, Uttarakhand with tagging the first unique ID barcode and issuing the PCC certificate. Shri Yadav said in a boost for Atmanirbar Bharat the PCC will provide certification for purity of Pashmina products and absence of prohibited fibre for hassle-free movement of the products from India. Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun had

All the tested products will be labeled with a traceable unique ID tag with individual e-certificates, enabling a seamless trade of such products in national and international markets. In the absence of such a facility in the country, commercial woolen products get under scrutiny to rule out the presence of prohibited fibers at the country's exit points, which causes delays in clearance and associated demurrage charges and financial/business loss to the exporters and traders. The PCC at WII, Dehradun, will assist honest exporters and traders involved in the trade of genuine Pashmina products. Setting up such a facility in India will be a game changer for the seamless trade of genuine Pashmina products with authentic certification. In concurrence with the Central Government's policy, it is a kind of facility based on the Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) model for assisting the Pashmina traders in obtaining authenticity certificates for selling certified and genuine Pashmina products. Under this MoU, the advanced technologies have been housed in a single facility supporting Pashmina test procedures. It is an example of a self-sustaining and revenue-generating facility in a government organization
